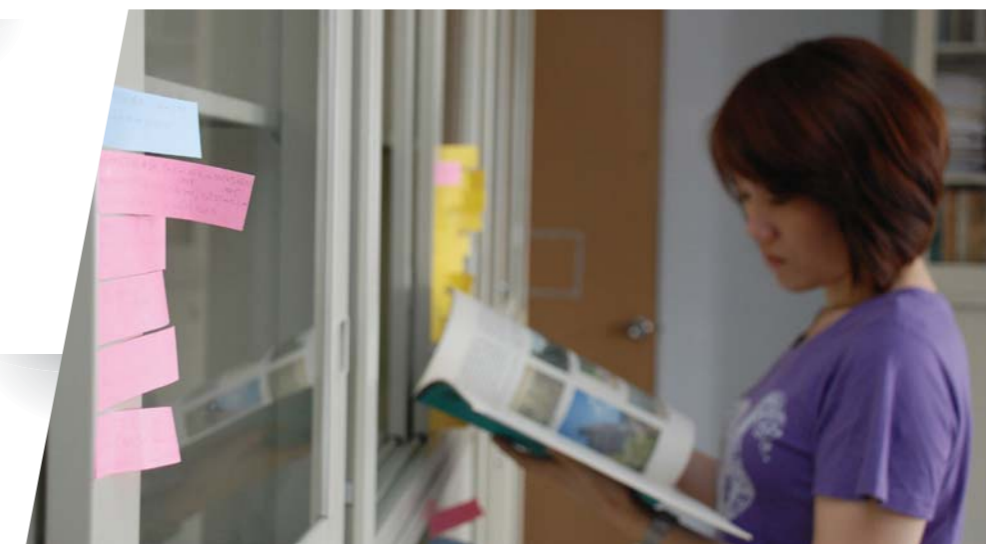


# College of Education



## About us

The College of Education was established on June 5, 1955, the same year that Provincial Taiwan Normal College was renamed National Taiwan Normal University. The College of Education initially had five core departments: Education, Social Education, Physical and Health Education, Home Economics Education, and Industrial Education. Today, we have seven departments, all of which have graduate schools offering Master's and PhD degrees. We also offer continuing education in the form of a Master's program.

## Mission

The College of Education has pioneered the idea of education reform emphasizing administration management; promoting education in the civic realm, health, and parenting; creating a digital learning environment and distant learning platforms; and providing lifelong learning and special education.

## International Cooperation

Partnerships range from MOUs to more active programs such as Student Exchange (SEA), Faculty Exchange (FEA), Dual Degrees and other short-term programs.
