ocated in Gong-guan campus, with more than 10 hectares in area, the College of Science was founded in 1955. The College of Science comprises five departments: Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Earth Sciences, and Computer Science & Information Engineering; and three independent graduate institutes: Environmental Education, Science Education, and Marine Environmental Science. In 2018, the Professional School of Life Science was established through the reorganization of the Department of Life Science to offer interdisciplinary subjects and training programs are provided at both undergraduate (B.Sc.) and graduate levels (M.Sc. and Ph.D. degrees). Programs in Nutrition Science were also established in School of Life Science to offer both undergraduate and graduate degrees (B.Sc. and M.Sc.).

We boast more than 170 faculty members, 50 supporting staff, 1,500 undergraduate students and 1,300 graduate students in the College. About 3% of the students are international students, and the number continues to grow as more English classes are provided from year to year. Most of the international students are supported by NTNU's partial tuition scholarships and scholarships from the Taiwanese government. In addition to academic programs, students enjoy many traditional Chinese activities organized by the Office of International Affairs (OIA), student societies, and the Mandarin Training Center (MTC) of NTNU.

The College of Science aims to nurture outstanding scientific and technological talents and to cultivate secondary school science teachers in parallel. The curricula are designed to prepare students for careers in a wide range of interdisciplinary fields in natural science. The cultivation and education of students is set out in accordance with curriculum maps to help students enrich their professional knowledge and skills for future career development. Faculty and teaching staff are actively engaged in research and teaching that provides an ideal learning environment on campus. Research results are published in internationally renowned journals. The College of Science has built strong bonds with partner universities worldwide, resulting in better international opportunities for our students.

Among the many outstanding alumni, there are five academicians at Academia Sinica, with many others currently holding important positions within both academia and industry circles. Our alumni network continues to grow and these links help encourage more students to study at the College, while also broadening the career development opportunities for our graduates.
