The Department of Adult & Continuing Education was established in 1955.

The master's (M.A.) program was set up in 1985 and was followed by a doctoral program in 1995. The undergraduate program encompasses four major learning areas:

- (1) Creative Design for Adult Learning
- (2) Program Design and Media Production
- (3) Innovation and Diffusion of Social and Cultural Industries
- (4) Organizational Learning and Management

The master's program has two subfields: 1) Adult and Continuing Education and 2) Management of Social Enterprises and Cultural Industries. An extension program is provided for adult learners from social education institutions and non-profit organizations.
