Undergraduate Program

Our undergraduate program is comprised of two divisions: History Education and General History. Students are required to earn credits from the four major curriculum groups: Taiwan History, Chinese History, World History and Applied History. The aim is to ensure that students obtain a broad and balanced insight into domestic and world histories and strengthen their professional training. In view of the diversification of today's society, we have also established a curriculum for applied history to better strengthen career opportunities for our students.

Master's and Doctoral Programs

In accordance with the focus and features of our department, our curriculum places particular emphasis on Chinese and Taiwan history. In addition to our basic curriculum syllabus, our faculty focuses on training in historical methods, historical theories, and essay writing, with the aim of enabling students to do independent research.
