Undergraduate Program

The undergraduate program is divided into two tracks: History Education and General History. Students earn credits in four major curriculum areas: Taiwan History, Chinese History, World History, and Applied History. This structure ensures that students gain a well-rounded understanding of both domestic and global histories while also offering practical training. Recognizing the diverse demands of modern society, we place special emphasis on Applied History, equipping students with skills for various career paths.

Master's and Doctoral Programs

Aligned with our department's focus, the graduate programs emphasize Chinese and Taiwan history. In addition to core courses, students receive rigorous training in historical methods, theories, and research writing. The curriculum is designed to foster independent research capabilities. Looking ahead, our department aims to expand academic research with a special emphasis on the themes of Ethnic Narratives and State Governance.
